Fall Athletic Season

Maryland Public Secondary Schools Athletic Association (MPSSAA) fall interscholastic athletic teams may begin practices on Wednesday, August 10, 2022. Though it is not mandatory that fall teams begin practice August 10, 2022, all teams must begin practices by Saturday, August 13, 2022. Teams may distribute equipment on Tuesday, August 9, 2022.

Fall Preseason Meetings

The coaches' preseason meetings for cheerleading, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, pompons, boys' and girls' soccer, and girls' volleyball will be held Tuesday, August 9, 2022, at Northwest High School. All coaches will attend the general session in addition to their respective sport-specific session.

The athletic trainers' preseason meeting will also be held on Tuesday, August 9, 2022, at Northwest High School from 10:30 a.m. until noon. We appreciate all that our ATCs do for our program!
