National Board Certification is a way to recognize accomplished teaching that is occurring in classrooms. The certification process is based on high and rigorous standards that evaluate teaching practice through performance-based assessments; the ultimate result is improved performance and achievement for students. Kudos to Mrs. Lea and Ms. Marino! We continue to be proud of our other NBC professional staff member, Jennifer Atanda.

Each month I highlight information contained within the <u>GES Policies and</u> <u>Procedures</u> document. It serves as a reminder of important policies that help keep our school running more smoothly. This month highlights the information on the **absences**. It read as follows:

Please call our school at (301) 353-8050 by 9:00 am, if your child will be absent. The answering machine will take your voice message between 4:45pm and 8am. In addition, a written explanation of each absence is required from the parent or guardian when the student returns to school.

301-353-8050

Please note, a monthly list of students' tardiness or absences is generated by the school system and sent to the principal.

Students who are late and/or absent more than 3 times each month (excused or unexcused) will automatically receive a letter from the principal. Students who are absent 20% or more days of school are considered habitually absent and may be referred to the Truancy Review Board.

Also note, one of our staff may call and/or schedule a meeting with families to discuss unexcused absences and tardies.

If families have gently worn GES spirit wear that your children have outgrown and you'd like to donate, please send them to the main office. We have a number of students that don't have spirit wear and it is cost-prohibitive for their families. We use the "gently loved" spirit wear as student incentives.


