Who should take CCRD 1?

Students' who plan on taking an abbreviated schedule in their senior year must take CCRD 1 their sophomore or junior year and then enroll in CCS (College Career Seminar) and SBWE (Site-Based Work Experience) their senior year. You will not be able to take a half day work schedule without being in this program. This program is also a program completer.

What is CCRD?
