

MCPS Dual Enrollment - Links to Early College, Virtual Middle College, and Jumpstart to College programs with videos and FAQs


MC Jumpstart to College (JC) Program

- Students are concurrently enrolled at a high school and at MC
- Students are fully admitted MC students
- Provides opportunities for high school students to earn college credits
- Student can enroll in any MC course as long as the requirements are met
- Small class size (Typically capped at 25 students)



MC Course Structure

- Course taught by MC faculty
- Courses run 15-, 13-, 7-, or 5weeks in length
- Course meets 1 4 times a week
- College curriculum includes distance learning component
- Final grade appears on college transcript





College Course Options







- Enroll in Distance Learning (asynchronous) or Structured Remote learning (synchronous) format
- Take in-person class at any MCcampus vaccination requirement
- College classes offered at high schools plans to resume in fall 2022



Fully Admitted College Students

- Jumpstart to College students are eligible for all MC privileges
 - College ID
 - Ride-On bus access (24/7)
 - Free learning & tutoring labs
 - Disability Support Services
 - Library access
 - On-line support
 - Cafeteria
 - More.....



Comparison Between JC & AP

Cost to Enroll at MC

- Example: A 3-credit MC course costs \$532.20 per AY2020-21
 - The same course taken during the school year would be discounted, as required by CCRCCA of 2013.

Amount student pays	3-credit class taken during summer	Same class taken during school year	Same class, with DE HS grant
MCPS student	\$532.20 + textbook	\$403.50 + textbook	\$267.30
MCPS student with FARMS status *	\$532.20 + textbook	\$136.20 + textbook	\$0

^{*} Student needs to complete <u>FARMS application</u> each year.



MC DE High School Grant

- HS students are not eligible for federal financial aid.
- MC offers a needs-based grant for families with less than AGI of \$100,000.
- Grant pays for MC fees and required textbook(s).
- Online application is available at MC Dual Enrollment program webpage – an application is needed each term.
- Grant has limited funds REGISTER & APPLY EARLY!



DE Standard Admission Criteria

- Unweighted GPA of 2.50 for seniors or 2.75 for juniors and younger.
- Qualifying test scores (SAT, ACT, or Accuplacer, etc.)
 - Waived during the COVID-19 pandemic
- Some courses require AP score or additional assessment.
- Approvals are needed EACH TERM from a parent, HS staff and MC representatives.

High school students have holds on their college accounts to prevent them from changing their schedule. All course adds and drops are handled by MC Jumpstart to College staff.



Don't Have Test Scores?

Use the Provisional Enrollment Policy for COVID-19

- Have at least a 2.75 unweighted HS GPA.
- Students can enroll in many introductory level credit bearing courses.
- Seniors and juniors are allowed to enrolled up to two courses during fall and spring terms.
- Sophomores and freshmen are allowed to enroll in one course from an approved list.



Enrollment Season – Winter & Spring

- In progress now Registration for spring term.
- December 20 start of five-week winter term.
- January 24 start of spring 2022 term.

Registration is handled on first-come, first-serve basis.

No registration is allowed once class has begun.



Enrollment Season – Summer & Fall

Sum I & II Terms

- Late March <u>Schedule viewing</u>
- April Registration begins
- May/June Summer I begins
- Mid-July Summer II begins

Fall Term


- Mid April <u>Schedule viewing</u>
- May Registration begins
- August/September Fall term begins



Reasons to Jumpstart with MC

- Academic challenge beyond AP/IB opportunities
- Enhances college admissions profile
- Graduate from high school with earned college credit
- Save money on college expense
- Gain confidence by learning in a collegiate environment
- All courses apply toward MC degree or transfer credits to college of your choice

MC Vaccine Requirement

- Montgomery College <u>requires</u>
 <u>COVID-19 vaccinations for</u>
 <u>employees and students.</u>
- Student must be enrolled first before submitting proof of vaccination.
- Students must submit proof of vaccination or request an exception.

Have an IEP or 504?

- IEP and 504 are not transferable to MC.
- Students must request services through <u>MC's</u>
 <u>Disability Support Services</u> (DSS).
- Accommodations may differ from those offered through high school.
- MC professors provide accommodations only to students who produce an Accommodations Letter from MC DSS office.

What is Next?

- Complete Dual Enrollment Admissions and Registration Procedures (steps 1-6).
 - Returning students complete step 1 & 4.
- Additional materials:
 - High school will provide the transcript
 - SAT or ACT scores, if available
 - AP scores or other assessment as needed

Which Course Should You Take?

- Majority of students take courses that fulfill the college general education requirements.
 - DE students are not allowed to take developmental courses.
- Some students elect to also receive HS credit (<u>MCPS</u>
 Dual Credit Refusal Form is needed each semester).
- High school students have holds to prevent them from changing their college courses. All adds and drops are handled by MC Dual Enrollment office.



MC Credit vs. Dual Credit

- To decide whether you should also receive high school credit, ask:
 - Do I need this MC course to graduate from high school?
 - How will the grade change my HS GPA?
 - MC courses are calculated at the same level as AP classes.
 - Will the 4-year institution accept the MC credit if it has been awarded HS credit? You may have to contact those schools to find out.

Transferability of MC Credit

As a two-year institution, MC helps students transfer to four-year institutions all over the country.

- Find out how your college credits will transfer to other MD institutions: https://artsys.usmd.edu/
- Contact out-of-state colleges and universities for transferability of MC credits
- Dual Credit (MC courses that have been given HS credit) are more likely to be rejected by other institutions.

MC Instruction Types

- In person Class will meet in-person at an MC campus.
- Distance Learning (DL) class will not have any meetings. Student will complete all the work online by him/herself according to published deadlines.
- Structured Remote (SR) –class will require virtual meetings 1-3 times a week, in addition to individual online work. Attendance is not optional.
- Hybrid—career tech courses that have specialized equipment will require some in-person meetings.
 Remaining work could be done online.

Virtual classes are delivered on Blackboard platform.
