

- Academy programs







What is an academy program?

An academy program:

- Offers a sequence of courses designed around a central theme
- Is a program of study developed to appeal to students' interests
- Is supported by an academy head and a team of teachers
- Helps students make connections between school learning and their personal interests and skills
- Enables students to explore future plans for college and/or careers



DCC High School *Choice*Process

Step #1Complete a *Choice* form.

Parents/students rank the 5 DCC high schools in order of preference, based on the academy programs at each school.

What if my child wants to attend his/her base area high school?

The base area high school is determined by a student's home address.* Assignment to a student's base high school is guaranteed if it is:

1) Indicated as 1st choice on the *Choice* form OR

2) Indicated as 2nd choice on the *Choice* form *AND* 1st choice is not available.








Step #2

Choice forms are run through a computerized lottery process.



Factors which may impact the school assignment process:

- School capacity (space availability)
- Number of students who choose their base school
- Ranking of schools on Choice form
- Sibling link
- Socio-economic diversity
- Gender balance

Step #3

High school assignment letters are mailed to students' homes.



What are some frequently asked questions?

What percentage of students received their 1st choice school this year?



What percentage received their 1st or 2nd choice?



Is transportation available to all DCC high schools?

Students will receive bus transportation if they live:

- in the DCC attendance area AND
- beyond walking distance of their assigned school (about two miles, as designated by MCPS).

Magnet Programs

- Not all students apply; highly competitive
- Prerequisites to be eligible to apply
 - Enrolled in Alg 1 or higher for all
 - Additional prerequisites depending on program related to theme
- Theme Based
- Accelerated and enriched curriculum in that thematic area
- Application process to include
 - Essays
 - Teacher Recs
 - Transcript Review
 - Testing



 Cohort classes for 3-4 periods of the day, 4 as part of general school community



Applicant Characteristics

Parents, ask yourselves: To an exceptional degree, does my child...

Show curiosity about ideas, events, and how things work or have a questioning attitude?

Demonstrate initiative and intellectual curiosity?

Have an ability to learn at a faster rate?

Answer questions with detail and elaboration?

Have strong critical and creative thinking abilities?

Have an ability to critique themselves and reflect on their work?

Have an ability to see relationships and detect patterns?

Take academic risks?

Understand his or her strengths AND know when and how to ask for help?

Look at a challenge as an opportunity for growth?

Science/Mathematics/Computer Science Magnet Program at Blair

• The magnet program offers accelerated, interdisciplinary courses in science, mathematics, and computer science for highly able students particularly interested in these subjects.

Applicants

- must be enrolled in at least Algebra I
- have strong problem solving and critical thinking skills
- enjoy collaborative research projects
- must reside in one of the following MCPS clusters:
 - Northeast Consortium (NEC), Downcounty Consortium (DCC) BCC, Winston Churchill,
 Walter Johnson, Richard Montgomery, Rockville, Sherwood, Whitman or Wootton*
- Magnet students have an extra period at end of day
 - eight period day instead of the normal seven period day
 - · four courses with cohort

Richard Montgomery IB Magnet Program*

- Located in Rockville
- The International Baccalaureate Programme is built upon an internationally recognized curriculum and governed by the IBO.
- Program for academically capable and committed students interested in pursuing a rigorous pre-university course of studies in: English, Foreign Language, Individuals and Societies Economics, Psychology, History, Experimental Sciences, Mathematics, and the Arts and Electives.
- Grade 8 students from <u>all</u> high school clusters may apply if they are...
 - enrolled in at least Level I of Spanish, French, or Chinese (or are qualified bilingual students who are fluent in those languages),
 - enrolled in at least Algebra I
 - are taking a minimum of 2 advanced courses
- Students successfully completing the program earn an MCPS diploma, a Maryland Certificate of Merit, and the internationally recognized IB Diploma.

 - enrolled in Algebra I or higher




Engineering Application-Only Program at Wheaton High School

- High level half-day program offering a broad perspective of the fine arts with an emphasis on drawing, painting and art history
- Opportunity to take AP Studio Art as juniors and seniors
- Applicants from all cluster high schools in MCPS
- Students can do ½ day at home high school and ½ day at Einstein OR transfer to Einstein for full day.
- Transportation is not provided
- Admission is selective. Applicants are evaluated on completed art courses, portfolio, personal interview, teacher recommendations, and transcript.
