Why do a Community Project?



IB requires, for schools in which the MYP finishes with year 3 (8th grade), that all students in the final year complete the community project.

What is the Community Project?

The community project is an independent, self-guided project that focuses on community and service and encourages students to explore their right and responsibility to implement service as action.

It gives students an opportunity to develop awareness of the needs of different communities and allows them to address those needs through service learning.


School-wide Support

Presentations will take place in April.





The Role of Your Student's Coach



Students can determine any way to document their learning.








Entries may include:

- Pictures, sketches
- Reflections- challenges / difficulties faced
- Brainstorming/ Thinking maps
